Abused and neglected children become involved in the court system due to no fault of their own. In Indiana, these cases are called Child in Need of Services (CHINS) cases. It is so very important that their voice is heard and that their best interests are vocalized. While others involved may have someone speaking for them, these children do not. That's where a CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate) volunteer comes in! Our local programs mobilize, train and empower volunteers who make a difference by helping judges make informed decisions about

what is best for the child's future. CASA volunteers have face-to-face contact with children sufficient to give fact-based information to the court as the judge considers the direction of the case. CASA volunteers are carefully screened, trained, appointed by the court, and supported by program staff so they can advocate for the child's best interests and help them have a safe and permanent home as soon as possible.

Survivor Speakout is a two-hour educational, victim impact panel pursuant to Indiana Code IC 9-30-14 designed to prevent people from driving impaired by any means. That includes alcohol, illegal drugs, prescription drugs or a combination of any of those. Anyone convicted of driving while under the influence of drugs or alcohol in Indiana is court ordered to attend a victim impact panel. Anyone convicted in any Indiana county, or on a diversion program, may attend Survivor Speakout and will be given a letter as proof of attendance. Visitors are always welcome. The presentation also includes impairment by alcohol, drugs, prescription drugs, texting, fatigue, sleeplessness, inattention to the road, eating, grooming, distracted driving and speeding. Any conditions caused by the driver that prevent responsible, safe operation of a vehicle causes impairment of some kind.

Participants train an average of 20 hours a week, and are paid the highest of federal, state or local minimum wage (\$7.25). Participants must be at least 55, unemployed, and have a family income of no more than 125% of the federal poverty level. Enrollment priority is given to veterans and qualified spouses, then to individuals who are over 65, have a disability, have low literacy skills or limited English proficiency, reside in a rural area, are homeless or at risk of homelessness, have low employment prospects, or have failed to find employment after using services through the American Job Center system.

Hendricks County Community Health Assessment (2018)

The 2018 Hendricks County Community Health Assessment provides a comprehensive look at the health and wellness of Hendricks County residents. During the year of 2018, local hospital systems and universities including Indiana University Health, Franciscan Alliance, Community Health Network, St. Vincent/Ascension, IU School of Public Health, and University of Evansville School of Health Sciences along with members of the Hendricks County Health Partnership, staff at the Hendricks County Health Department, and staff at Hendricks Regional Health collaborated to conduct a county-wide primary survey of residents' health needs and behaviors. In addition to the primary survey, IU Health West hosted a focus-leader meeting including representatives from various health agencies in the county to discuss and identify the most urgent health needs according to their experience and witness, as well as a key stakeholder interview with a representative from the Hendricks County Health Department to discuss the focus-leaders' conclusions. Following this, staff members at the Hendricks County Health Department conducted a secondary data review which includes the most recent, county-specific data available from national sources such as the U.S. Census Bureau, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, and the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

BABY & ME – Tobacco Free™ is a free quit-smoking program uniquely created for pregnant women to help them quit during pregnancy and stay quit after giving birth. It is an evidenced-based, smoking cessation program designed to reduce the burden of tobacco. During pregnancy, participants receive four prenatal counseling cessation sessions for education and support to quit smoking. They will also be offered referrals to the Indiana Tobacco Quitline as well as other community services. At prenatal sessions 3 and 4, women may receive their first two diaper vouchers as well as a new diaper bag and baby items, if they test tobacco free. After birth, participants receive monthly follow-up sessions and if proven to be smoke-free, receive a monthly diaper voucher for up to twelve months postpartum. There are no income or age restrictions for the program. Participants must be a daily smoker or was a daily smoker within three months of becoming pregnant, be willing to quit all tobacco products, participate in 4 prenatal sessions, and take monthly breath tests to determine tobacco use. A smoker who lives with the pregnant woman can also enroll into the program and if successfully quits smoking, may receive diaper vouchers during the postpartum period. Sessions can be conducted at the woman's home, at our offices, or another convenient location. **To enroll in the program or to become a referral partner, call (317) 745-9215.**
