#### Meet the Presenter



Frederic Reamer is Professor Emeritus in the graduate program, School of Social Work, at Rhode Island College. His teaching and research focus on professional ethics,

criminal justice, mental health, health care, and public policy. Dr. Reamer received his Ph.D. from the University of Chicago and has served as a social worker in correctional and mental health settings. He chaired the national task force that wrote the Code of Ethics adopted by the National Association of Social Workers in 1996 and served on the code revision task force. Dr. Reamer also chaired the national task force sponsored by the National Association of Social Workers, Association of Social Work Boards, Council on Social Work Education, and Clinical Social Work Association which developed technology standards for the profession. His recent book, Risk Management in the Behavioral Health *Professions,* is a comprehensive handbook for mental health and social service providers on the prevention of malpractice.

### Information on Webinar

This webinar will provide participants with an overview and in-depth examination of complex ethical and risk-management challenges in behavioral health. Dr. Reamer will explore highrisk ethical issues and practical strategies designed to protect clients and practitioners. Key topics will include boundary issues, dual relationships, conflicts of interest, confidentiality, privileged communication, informed consent, clients' rights, termination of services, practitioners' and clients' use of technology for remote service delivery and communication. He will discuss relevant ethical standards: statutes. regulations, and case, law; national practice standards; documentation; supervision and consultation.
